### DRESS STANDARDS

It has been brought to the House Committee's attention that some members and their guests have not been conforming to the Club's Dress Standards and as such the Food & Beverage Staff have been tasked to enforce the requirements.

We remind members to encourage their guests to dress in an appropriate manner so as to ensure the facility is enjoyed by all members and their guests.

Any member who is not appropriately attired may be refused service.

***Neat casual dress is the acceptable standard of dress in our Clubrooms.***

Before 6:30pm shirts with shorts or slacks and acceptable footwear. Tank tops, singlets or the like are not considered shirts. Wet Sailing Gear is not permitted.

After 6:30pm members must wear a collared shirt with slacks or shorts with shoes.

It should be noted that suitable footwear is to be worn at all times and that slip on thongs (rubber or leather) are not permitted in the club bar or dining areas. Bare feet are not permitted in the clubrooms or on the Quarterdeck and children must be made aware of this for their own safety.

### ***Hats in the Bar Area***

SoPYC observes the tradition of not allowing members or their guests to wear hats in the Clubhouse. A penalty for doing so is usually applied the wearer has to **"Buy for the Bar"** which in our Club is two jugs of beer. **Exceptions to this rule:**

- Melbourne Cup luncheon
- "Canteen" day – children with cancer
- Party hats at our official Christmas lunch

***The Barnacle Bar is available during the day for members working on their boats and who do not meet the dress code. Suitable attire includes Manual Working Clothes; and Sailing Shorts, Shirts and Footwear. Wetsuits and Sailing Booties are not acceptable.***
