NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Prescriptions of Yachting Australia ("YA") will apply. A copy of YA Special Regulations Part 2 For Off The Beach Boats forms part of this Notice of Race and can be obtained from the regatta website at www.f15austrnationals2012.yachting.org.au
- 1.3 The Class Rules of Flying Fifteen International ("FFI") and the National Championship By-Laws of Flying Fifteen International Australia Inc ("FFIA") will apply.
- 1.4 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 ADVERTISING

Advertising shall be in accordance with Class rule B17; however, the forward 25% section of the hull length on boat's sides shall be reserved to affix event advertising and bow numbers.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the International Flying Fifteen Class which hold a valid FFI Measurement Certificate and are entered on the FFIA Register of Boats or are registered with an association established outside Australia affiliated with FFI.
- 3.2 Both helm and crew shall be financial members of YA or affiliated to an alternative Member National Authority. YA members shall be required to present their current YA Membership Card at registration.
- 3.3 The boat's owner shall be a full member of a recognised State or National Flying Fifteen Association with affiliation to FFI. In addition, the boat's helm and crew shall each be a current member of a recognised State or National Flying Fifteen Association.
- 3.4 Persons nominated on the entry form to sail the boat in the Championship may not be substituted without the permission of the Race Committee. Any substitute thus permitted shall not helm the boat.
- 3.5 All entrants will compete in the Open Division, while entries will be accepted for both Classic and Silver Divisions.
 - (a) The Classic Division is open to all boats with sail numbers below 2701, but excluding boats which have had substantial hull shell modifications, and in addition including unmodified boats with sail numbers above 2700 derived from genuine Classic moulds. A definitive listing of boats qualifying for Classic status is published on the Flying Fifteen International website at www.flying15.org and in the current Flying Fifteen International Yearbook.
 - (b) The Silver Division is open to boats with registrations from 2701 to 3329 and also includes any boats with sail numbers below 2701 that do not meet the criteria for Classic Division. The upper figure of 3329 may be raised by FFIA in its annual review in April 2011.
 - (c) Any dispute regarding the eligibility of a boat in either of the above sub-divisions will be resolved by the National Chief Measurer whose decision will be final.

- 3.6 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form and where applicable the Parent/Guardian/Custodian Consent form accompanying this Notice of Race, and sending it by Wednesday 7 December 2011 together with the required fee to:

Forms for ordering regatta shirts, merchandise and additional tickets to social events and to register for Home Hosting also accompany this Notice of Race, and should be completed and forwarded with entry forms and where applicable the Parent/Guardian/Custodian Consent form.

4 FEES

- 4.1 The entry fee for the regatta is \$380 and includes the costs of two copies of the Flying Fifteen 50th Anniversary Book, two copies of a compact disk incorporating regatta photographs and two tickets to attend the Welcome Function, the Stalwarts and Legends Function and the Presentation Dinner. Regatta shirts and additional tickets to any of the social functions may be ordered and must be paid for together with the entry fee. A home hosted dinner for invited spectators, competitors and their partners will be at no cost but guests are expected to bring their own drinks.
- 4.2 Entries submitted after Wednesday 7 December 2011 will be late entries. Late entries will be accepted by the Regatta Office at South of Perth Yacht Club ("SoPYC") up to 1500 hours on Friday 6 January 2012 on payment of a late entry fee of \$100.

5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Registration, measurement and inspection will be conducted from the Regatta Office at SoPYC between 0900 hours and 1600 hrs on Friday and Saturday 6 and 7 January 2012 respectively.
- 5.2 A competitors' meeting will be conducted in the ballroom of SoPYC on Sunday 8 January 2012 at 1100 hours.
- 5.3 The event will comprise an invitation race and eight championship races as scheduled below. The dates and times of racing are as follows:

6 REGISTRATION AND MEASUREMENT

- 6.1 At registration all entrants are required to present the boat's measurement certificate, together with proof of current financial membership of a Flying Fifteen International Class Association, and skipper and crew membership of, or affiliation to, their Member National Authority.
- 6.2 Following registration a boat must be presented for safety and measurement inspections. Not more than two mainsails, two headsails, and two spinnakers shall be registered for use in the regatta. A boat's entry will not be deemed complete until these checks have been satisfactorily completed. In the event that a sail or spar has been lost or damaged during the course of the championship to such an extent that it cannot be used, the Race Committee may authorise the use of a replacement sail or spar.
- 6.3 As required by the race committee or as directed by the protest committee, a boat may be inspected and re-measured at any time during the regatta.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available on both the SoPYC and Regatta web site from 7 December 2011 and from 0900 hrs on Friday 6 January 2012 at the Regatta Office at SoPYC. The SoPYC web site is located at www.sopyc.com.au and the National Championship web site is at www.f15austnationals2012.yachting.org.au

8 VENUE

- 8.1 SoPYC is located 8 kilometres from the Perth Central Business District at Coffee Point, Applecross. The Regatta Office will be located in the Committee Room on the ground floor near the Club Office.
- 8.2 The Invitation Race will be conducted on the Swan River area known as Melville Water East. All Championship races will be conducted on the Swan River area known as Melville Water West. See Attachment A.
- 8.3 A map showing the location of SoPYC, local suburbs and racing areas together with an aerial photograph of the Club and its facilities is attached to this Notice of Race. See Attachment B.

9 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be described in detail in the Sailing Instructions and will consist of a combination of windward, leeward, and reaching legs

10 SCORING

- 10.1 Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 (a) When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- (b) When from five to seven races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

(c) When eight races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst two scores.

10.3 The regatta handicap results will be determined by back calculation using the "Finishing Line" scoring program. Points will be awarded for handicap results in accordance with 10.2 above. A boat that finishes in the first three places in either the Open, Silver, or Classic Division will be ineligible to win the handicap trophy.

11 SUPPORT BOATS

11.1 All support boats shall be registered with the organizing authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and event support boat regulations. The organizing authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion.

11.2 An orange flag will be displayed approximately five minutes before the commencement of the start sequence for each race. On this signal, all non race committee boats must promptly depart the race area exclusion zone for the duration of the race, unless called on to assist by the Race Committee. The race area exclusion zone is as follows;

(i) At least 100 metres clear of all course, start and finish marks.

(ii) At least 100 metres outside the course area including lay lines.

This instruction continues to apply if a general recall or postponement is signaled but not after a race is abandoned.

11.3 Coach and support boats shall fly an identifying flag which will be supplied by the race committee and this must be clearly displayed at all times while afloat.

12 RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make nor receive radio communications whilst racing. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

13 PRIZES

13.2 In addition to perpetual trophies, winning crews will be awarded commemorative trophies to retain.

13.3 Special commemorative pennants will be presented to first, second and third place getters in each division and for results on handicap at the conclusion of racing each day at a presentation at the alfresco dining area at the main SoPYC club house. Other prizes may also be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Committee on these occasions.

13.4 Major championship prizes will be presented at the Presentation Dinner

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

15 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$A5,000,000 (recommended \$A10,000,000) per event or the equivalent. By signing the Entry Form, helmspersons are deemed to have made a declaration that they have such cover.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. The regatta will be a 'dry' regatta, with each boat being allocated a parking bay within the grounds of SoPYC. Launching and retrieval of boats is either:
 - (a) via one of three cranes located at the Eastern End of the boat parking area known as the Western Hardstand. Certified lifting gear is required to utilise the cranes which shall only be operated by authorised volunteers.
 - (b) via a launching ramp adjacent to the Western Hardstand boat park, requiring hand towing of trolleys or road trailers.
2. The SoPYC will provide bar, canteen and restaurant facilities throughout the regatta. The opening hours of the various bars and restaurants will be displayed on the Regatta Notice Board.
3. All entrants and adult members of their party will be granted temporary membership of the SoPYC for the period of the regatta. Upon application membership keys will be provided to temporary members that will allow access to the Club grounds and parking areas. These keys can also be used to purchase goods and services from all club restaurants and bars. Provision of the keys will need to be supported by a major credit card for the charge of goods and services purchased and a charge in respect of a refundable security deposit for the key of \$50. A statement will be forwarded in respect of any charges made to credit cards pursuant to the temporary membership key facility. An application form for a temporary membership key is attached.
4. Provision will be made for the temporary storage of shipping containers within the grounds of SoPYC during the regatta. Road trailers or trolleys suitable for Flying Fifteen boats will be made available free of charge to participants bringing their boats to the regatta via sea containers. Participants requiring space allocation for a shipping container and road trailers or trolleys should contact the Chairman of the Organising Committee no later than 15 November 2011.
5. Participants' road trailers can be stored during the championship for those entrants wishing to transfer their boats to their own launching trolleys. A lifting gantry and boat hoist is available if required by competitors.
6. Provision will be made for competitors to leave their boats (on trailers) at the SoPYC for limited periods before or after the regatta, after prior arrangement with the Chairman of the Organising Committee.
7. A privately owned and operated marine chandlery is based at SoPYC and will be open during normal business hours. Information on available sail makers and boat repairers will be available at the Regatta Office during the event.
8. A wide choice of suitable forms of accommodation is available in Perth. SoPYC is only eight kilometres from the Perth CBD. Early January will be a very busy period for tourists due to other events, and it is recommended that bookings be made as early as possible.
 - (a) Accommodation information is available on numerous websites including;
www.westernaustralia.com.au, www.experienceperth.com, www.bestofwa.com.au.
When conducting an internet search nearby suburbs are Applecross, Como, South Perth, Perth, East Fremantle and Fremantle.
 - (b) Where required, billeted accommodation will be made available for skippers and crews of boats being transported from overseas to compete in the regatta. Participants wishing to avail themselves of billeted accommodation should contact the Chairman of the Organising Committee no later than 15 November 2011.
 - (c) Limited space will be available within the club grounds for participants who wish to camp at the Club in tents or caravans during the period of the regatta. As space is limited reservations will need to be made with the Chairman of the Organising Committee no later than 15 November 2011.
9. Interstate and overseas visitors not directly involved with the racing will be able to watch the racing from spectator craft being made available by members of the SoPYC. In order to ascertain requirements for spectator vessels please complete the required information on the attached spectator registration form.
10. Wireless internet connection will be available at the SoPYC for visitor access to the internet.
11. Interstate and overseas visitors not directly involved with racing will have convenient access to a wide range of interesting attractions within close proximity to Perth.

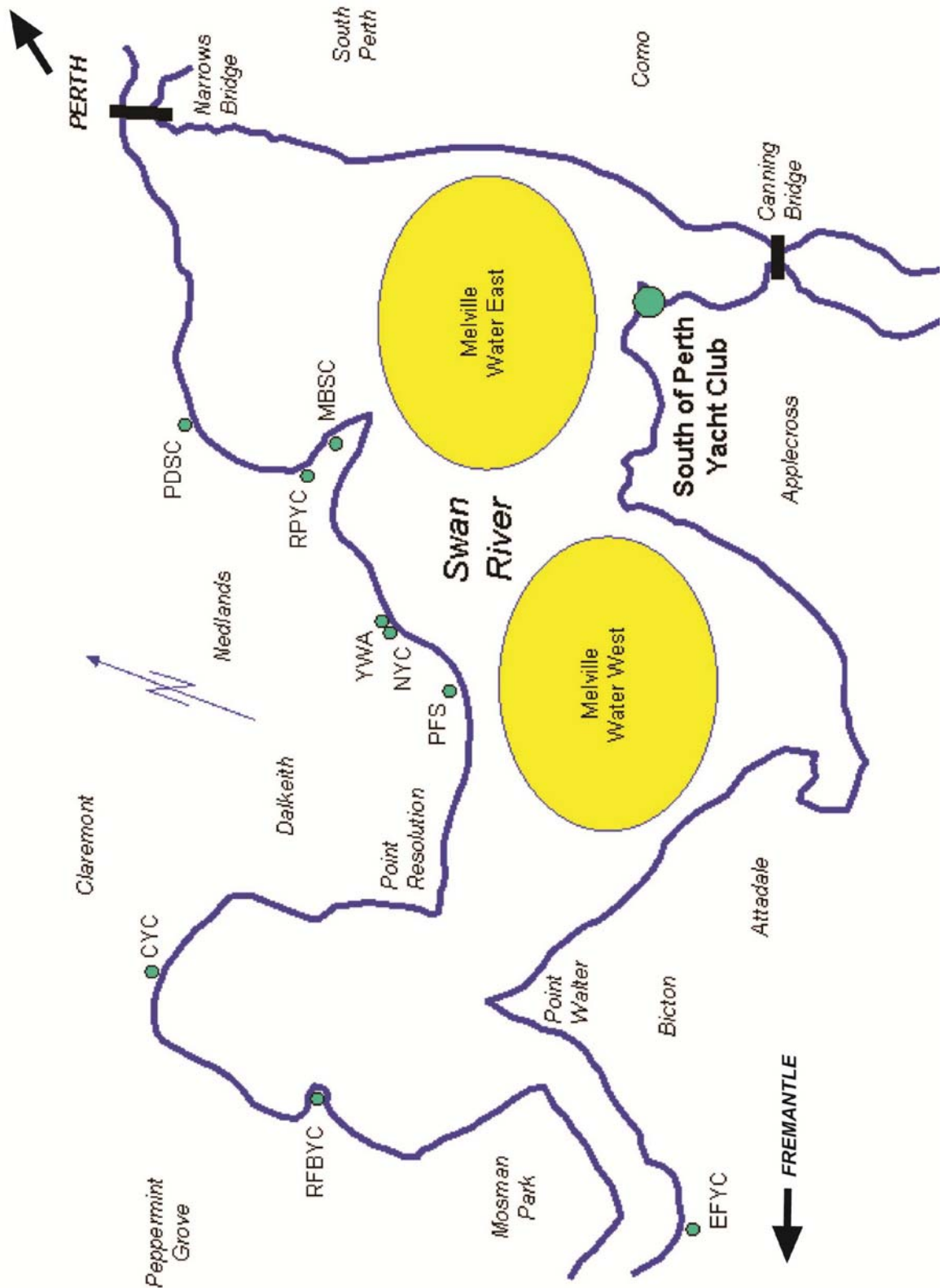
