Temporary Notice to Mariners

NAVIGATIONAL HAZARD Marine Cable Route Survey Nearshore and Offshore Waters Perth Metropolitan Area

Mariners are advised that marine survey operations will be carried out in state and coastal waters off Scarborough & City Beach in a 500m corridor extending out from the 30m water depth contour. Survey operations will **commence around 7 December 2011 for a period of four (4) to eight (8) days and be performed on a 24 hour basis.**

Operations, including towing of surface and subsurface survey equipment (tow length 3 x water depth), will be undertaken by the MV EGS Explorer (restricted in her ability to manoeuvre). All vessels taking part in this survey will exhibit shapes and lights in accordance with the Prevention of Collisions at Sea Regulations 1983 at all times.

The survey route is as follows:

As plotted on Department of Transport Chart WA001, Datum GDA94, January 2010, Edition 16:

start point: Lat 31°44.5', Long 115°30.1',

end point: Lat 31°46.9' Long 115°04.2'

bearing: 090°

Operators will monitor VHF: Channel 16.
