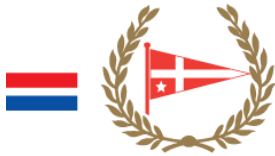
The vision statement reflects our emphasis upon both on-water competition and participation as “core” to the purpose of the club. The statement was developed with the contribution of the management team and members.

MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Thank you for your interest in the South of Perth Yacht Club, one of the finest yacht clubs, not only on the Swan River, but in the whole of the state. Our Club offers a complete range of sailing, power boating and social activities and opportunities for all.

Located less than 10 minutes from Perth CBD, the Club has land and water pens, slip way, swinging moorings, ample car parking, restaurant with views across the Swan and Canning Rivers to Perth, three bars, alfresco dining and function centre.

South of Perth features a wide diversity of yachting classes and divisions from junior training dinghies to ocean racing craft and a very social cruising section. Our competitive time trialling power boat fleets are the largest on the river, and welcome and accommodate the inexperienced and expert alike.

With a full programme of social events each year, a la carte and casual dining and outdoor and indoor bars, there is something for everyone seven days a week.

We are absolutely sure that joining the South of Perth Yacht Club is a decision you'll look back on with both pride and pleasure. NEW MEMBER APPLICATIONS:

All applicants must be nominated by a Proposer and Secunder who are full ordinary members of South of Perth Yacht Club. No applications will be accepted without these signatures. If you do not know any club members, please contact the membership chairman who will be able to assist with this requirement.

Once an application has been submitted complete with signatures and payment, a letter of acknowledgement will be forwarded, attached to which will be a yellow provisional membership card which will allow immediate use of the facilities. No credit facilities are extended under a provisional membership.

All Applicants are required to attend an induction evening before formal acceptance will be granted. Induction evenings are held on the third Wednesday of each month and are conducted by the Membership Chairman and his Committee and are of approximately one to one and a half hours in duration. Applicants unable to attend their scheduled induction must attend the following month.

Failure to attend three consecutive inductions may result in cancellation of the application for membership following which all membership fees paid will be refunded.

During this process, applicants name are placed on the clubs notice board for a minimum of fourteen days prior to receiving Management Committee formal approval. Management Committee meets on the fourth Tuesday of each month.

Once formal approval has been obtained, you will be sent an approval letter inviting you to call into the office to collect your gate key. Your membership card and car sticker will be sent to you separately.

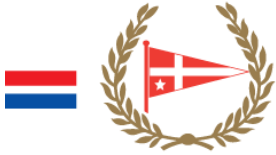

The Barnacle Bar is available during the day for members working on their boats and who do not meet the dress code. **No caps or hats at any time in the Clubhouse please.**

FEES AND CHARGES:

Our membership fees are inclusive of GST and are subject to change without notice. Please refer to the Fee and Service Schedule Attachment.

The annual subscription will be a pro-rata amount to 30 June calculated at the time of joining.

Annual subscription fees include Yachting Western Australia (YWA) and Yachting Australia (YA) affiliation fees and are not subject to pro-rata.

All members (except Crew, Associate and Junior) have a 30 day trading account with the club. To avoid overdue fees, please ensure accounts are settled by the due date.

House Support Scheme Vouchers

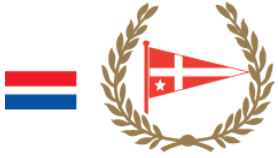
All members (except Crew, Country, Junior and Associate) are billed \$110.00 quarterly in March, July, September and December for the House Support Scheme (Vouchers). These may be used in the Club's bars and restaurants but cannot be used to settle other charges such as fees and levies.

Electronic Key

Where applicable to Membership Category - \$55.00. The key may be used to operate a charge account across the bar, access the House Support Scheme Vouchers and to gain entry through the front gates.

New Member Cocktail Party

Held quarterly for all new members - \$40.00 per couple.



Boat Registration Fee

An annual boat registration fee is charged at commencement of the applicable season.

FACILITIES:

Slipping Facilities and Charges

Slipping facilities may be booked through the office. Fees are \$87.00 for day 1, each subsequent day or part thereof \$36.00. Non members by special arrangement with the General Manager, (Double the members' rate). Slipping is carried out Monday to Friday 7:00am to 3:00pm. Saturdays by appointment only. If unable to slip your boat on the date booked, please give at least 72 hours notice to the office to ensure you are not charged.

Pressure Spray

Half hour per token. First token \$22.50, Second token \$11.25 per vessel. Tokens available from the office.

Pens and Moorings

Waiting list for water and land pens change regularly. The office can provide up to date information.

Participation by members ensures the continued success of our Club. Preference in pen allocation will be given to those who are, or who commit themselves to be, actively involved in Club events.

Applications must be made in writing to the Pens & Mooring Committee. All registered owners of the vessel have to be included on the Club Register. A NON-REFUNDABLE fee is charged to all FIRST pen holders. Pen fees are available in TWO equal amounts each year in the months of June and December.

Pen Fees

Water pens fees vary depending upon the pens size allocated and the office can help with further details.

A vessel cannot be penned, launched, moored or brought into the Club area (land or water) unless registered with the Club and having a current Marina Compliance Certificate and then only with the express permission of the Chairman of the Pens and Moorings Committee. All members with craft in the marina or on moorings must comply with the Boat Harbour Regulations and the Fire and Safety rules.

Launching Ramp

The ramp is for use by Full Ordinary members for launching club registered vessels that are kept away from the premises. A fee of \$165.75 per year applies.

Use of Main Fuel Jetty

Only craft holding a current SoPYC Marina Compliance Certificate (or one from another affiliated YAWA Club) may come alongside. Craft may not be left alongside without permission of the Pens & Moorings Committee Chairman or the Club Manager. Both sides of refuelling portion of the main wharf are to be kept free unless the craft is being refuelled.

Fishing and swimming from all Club jetties and wharves is prohibited.

Fuel

To obtain fuel, the follow procedures apply:

- Step 1: Hold your member key to the two small sensors on the RHS of the box located on top of the bowser. These look like to small bolts set proud of the steel with the top sensor more prominent than the bottom sensor (see diagram on the box). The centre of the yellow key needs to touch the lower sensor and the outer edge of the key needs to touch the top edge of the key.
- Step 2: Type in your individual pin number and press Enter located at the bottom RHS of the key pad.
- Step 3: Enter the pump number, 1 = diesel, 2 = unleaded.
- Step 4: Fill in the details of the sale and return fuel book to the fuel box

Ice

An ICE BOX KEY is available from office at a cost of \$5.00. Please fill out the docket book provided with membership number, name and signature. Ice is also available from the bar.

Rubbish

Rubbish bins are distributed throughout the grounds. Please ensure oils and other liquids are not placed in these bins. Oil should be placed in the containers at the commencement of "B" and "C" jetties.

Gate

A security gate key is issued to Full Ordinary, Family, Country, Centreboard and Social members on payment of \$55.00. The key is required to enable access to the parking area at all times. Social members are prohibited from parking on the club premises from 10:00am to 4:00pm on all Club and regatta competition days Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.

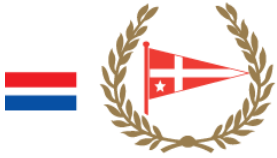
Merchandise

CATEGORIES OF MEMBERSHIP

The South of Perth Yacht Club offers members the choice of voting and non-voting categories of memberships. Members of the South of Perth Yacht Club receive the following benefits -

Variations of membership categories allow the entire family to enjoy the Club at a membership level they are comfortable with.

ORDINARY MEMBERSHIP provides for the competitive sailor with full club voting rights (over 18yrs), the use of all club amenities, including boat parks and all other associated sailing facilities. There are variations in full membership (including junior, family and centreboard memberships).

CREW MEMBERSHIP is available to anyone over 18yrs who regularly crews on vessels participating in club events. It provides the use of all club amenities, including car parks and hardstand upon request.

COUNTRY MEMBERSHIP is available to anyone over the age of 18yrs whose usual place of residence is more than 100km radius from the club.

RECIPROCAL MEMBERSHIP is available to any person who is a financial full member of another yacht club.

SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP provides for the person who is interested in the social side of the club, no voting rights, ranging from non competitive sailing, to the enjoyment gained by being involved within the social life of a true sporting club.

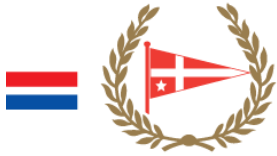

- Subscriptions are due and payable by 1 July each year. However members can make written application to pay half of their subscriptions by 1 July and the other half by 31 January of the following year.
- Pro rata subscriptions apply to members joining during a financial year.
- House Support Scheme - \$110.00 per quarter (charged in July, September, December and March). Vouchers are required to be paid for and spent in the quarter in which they are issued.
- Gate Key Payment \$55.00 (Only to eligible categories)
- New Member Cocktail Party \$40.00 per couple (Payable by all categories except Junior)
- The annual subscription fee is inclusive of both Yachting Association of Western Australia (YAWA) and Australian Yachting Federation (AYF) affiliation fees
- Student Discount: An ordinary member engaged in educational courses or vocational training which precludes them from earning a regular income, may apply to the Management Committee for a reduction at half the annual subscription rate.
