and South of Perth Yacht Club (Inc)

1 DESCRIPTION OF EVENT

A series held over two race days bringing together the Western Australian fleets to remember and celebrate the life of Tally Hobbs who introduced the Flying Fifteen to Australia in 1950.

2 RULES

The regattas will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-12.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the International Flying Fifteen Class whose skipper is a member of FFIWA and a yacht club which is affiliated with YWA.
- 3.2 Eligible boats must enter by 7 PM, Thursday 5 November 2009 by e-mail to John Hassen, Chairperson, SoPYC FF Section advising boat name, sail number, helm and crew names. E-mail -- hasman@iinet.net.au.
If only sailing at RFBYC, entries containing the above information must be e-mailed by 7 PM, Thursday, 18 February 2010 to Peter Mudford, RFBYC FF Fleet Captain -- Email -- muddi057@yahoo.com.au.
Late entries may be received at the discretion of the Fleet Captains and race committee.

5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Warning Signal for race 1 on 8 November will be 0900. Races 2 – 4 to follow.
Warning Signal for race 5 on 21 February will be 1000. Races 6 – 8 to follow.
- 5.2 Presentation of results will be held at Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Club following racing on the 21 February 2009

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be made available from RFBYC and SoPYC or the respective Fleet Captains. They may also be published on the FFIWA website.

7 VENUE

Races on 8 November 2008 will be on short courses adjacent to the South of Perth Yacht Club.
Races on 21 February 2009 will be on courses adjacent to the Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Club.

8 THE COURSES

Windward/leeward and triangular courses are to be sailed as described in the Sailing Instructions.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 4 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will
be the total of her race scores.
- (b) When from 5 to 7 races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- (c) When 8 races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

11 PRIZES

Pennants will be presented to Classic, Silver and Open fleets for 1st, 2nd and 3rd overall. The Tally Hobbs Memorial Series' Perpetual Trophy will be presented and engraved with the winners from each division.

12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
