## Temporary Notice to Mariners

### NAVIGATIONAL HAZARD Marine Cable Route Survey Nearshore Waters Perth Metropolitan Area

Mariners are advised that marine survey operations will be carried out in state and coastal waters adjacent to Scarborough & City Beach in an area approx three (3) to ten (10) kilometres from the shore. Survey operations will commence around early to mid October 2011 for a period of up to seven (7) days and take place during daylight hours only.

Operations, including towing of surface and subsurface survey equipment (tow length less than 50m), will be undertaken by the **MV Linni** (restricted in her ability to manoeuvre), with support vessels in attendance as required. All vessels taking part in this survey will exhibit shapes and lights in accordance with the Prevention of Collisions at Sea Regulations 1983 at all times.

The survey route is as follows:

**As plotted on Department of Transport Chart WA001, Datum GDA94, January 2010, Edition 16:**

**Start point:** Lat 115°44' Long 31°55'

**End point:** Lat 115°40' Long 31°52'

**Bearing:** 315°
